#### III. REGION AND EXECUTIVE REPORTS

## A. Region Senator Reports

External Affairs Senator Hasun Khan updated the delegation on his duties as SSCCC Communications Officer, including creating materials for region outreach, conducting legislative visits and chairing the Communications Committee. He also stated his duties regarding Region VII, which include providing strategic planning and legislative updates. Senator Khan also advised the delegation to keep in mind the Governance and Policy Senator must be trusted to represent the region fairly within the SSCCC. He stated the state currently has too many senators who take on the position solely for the acclaim and recognition, instead of working to empower the students. He urged the delegation to ask difficult questions and ask nominees to show their commitment to student government.

#### **B. Executive Officer Reports**

President Kutrell Prescott apologized for the inconsistencies in scheduling and stated the region will actively work on ameliorating the issue. He announced there will be a delegate training on February 22 at the Downtown Central Library to aid in building local advocacy, making effective legislative visits, and resolution writing.

Vice President Yana Demeshko apologized for her absence due to SSCCC duties in Sacramento. She resigned as Chair of the regional Communications Committee and stated Compton Center Delegate Gregory Peterson wis the new Chair. Meetings will take place every other Wednesday at 8 P.M. In a General Assembly Planning Committee update, she informed the delegation Spring 2015 GA will take place in the South again, in Ontario Convention Centre (Region IX). She will work with EA Senator Khan to create promotional materials. For further information about GA, she urges interested parties to direct questions to GP Senator Noyola. In a March in March 2015 update, VP Demeshko stated the official flyer has been released through Facebook. March in March will take place on March 2, 2015.
